

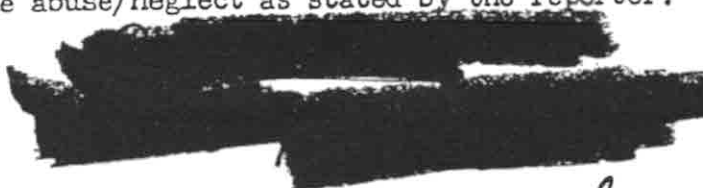

Results: Ms. Van Houte stated she received a phone call from (YOU) Ruby Miles that Charles had run away early that evening with another boy named James. I was told to contact YOU in the morning. A runaway report had been filed.


Assessment: Charles ran.

Results: I spoke with Ms. Henry, who stated she would put his records in the mail today and send them to me.

Assessment: Records will be sent.

Purpose: Inquire on placement date.

Results: Mr. Smith stated I could bring Charles on 2-11-83. I told him a clothing voucher would be made to Weiner's in Austin for him to take Charles shopping.

I told her that I didn't think a visit next weekend was a good idea either, but told her that I would talk further to her about the possibility of a visit next week.



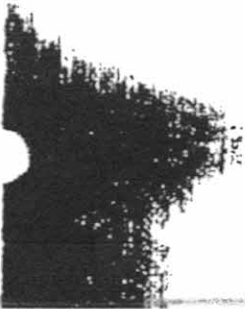

EDUCATIONAL HISTORY:

Charles will be in the 5th grade at Peter Janowski school in the fall. His mother says he's always had problems in school; he repeated both t 1st and 2nd grades. His biggest problems have been with math and spel ing; he himself says he likes science best. He began in Coop School, then moved to Scarborough, then went back to Coop, and then to Peter Janowski. In the 4th grade, he was in a private learning center (?).

DEVELOPMENTAL HISTORY:

On 11-13-84 Mary Perteet said that she returned to Betty's home to get the baby. However, when she picked the baby up she was confronted by Charles, who pulled a hunting knife on her and demanded \$250.00 for the baby. Mary said that Betty too demanded \$250.00. At this point Ms. Perteet left the baby, and the home. She decided to file charges because she still feels that the baby is endangered.

Assessment: I have never known Betty to attempt to harm any of her children. However, Betty does suffer from depression. I saw Timothy Perteet on 11-12-84. He looked fine to me.

Next Step: Investigate case.

Results: Ms. Perteet would not discuss the case with me. She said that she had no way of knowing who I was. I gave Ms. Perteet my number and suggested that she call me back. She promised to do so.

Timothy had on a diaper, and except for a mosquito bite on his shoulder had no bruises. He was very alert. I explained to Betty why I had come to the home. I told her of the allegations. She said that none of them were true. She said that her cousin had been at the home on 11-8-84, but that she had not tried to kill herself or her son. She said that she loves Timothy, and would never harm him. Betty said that Mary Perteet began showing up shortly after the birth of the baby, and that Mary had been trying to talk her into placing Timothy into adoption. She said that she refused to do so. She said that she feels that Mary Perteet was supposed to get money if she could deliver Timothy to an adoptive home. She has no proof of this, but feels that money could have been the on motivator for the report.

As for the incident on 11-13-84, both Charles and Betty deny asking for \$250.00. Charles admitted to having a knife, but said that he at no time threaten Marv. He said Marv was told that she couldn't take the baby. He said that later in the day Marv's husband came to the home and threatened to shoot him. Wanda Robinson said that she had never known Betty to harm any of her children. Later, Betty's sister Marv Lan arrived, and supported Betty. She described Mary Pe as a troublemaker. She said that she would keep Tim before letting Betty give him to Mary Perteet.

Prior to leaving, I spoke with Helen Ramirez who resides in front of the Perteet apt. in Apt. 1. Ms. Ramirez said that she was at home on 11-8 and 11-13, and that she saw or heard nothing unusual on either those days. She said that has never known Betty to mistreat her baby.

Assessment: There is not enough evidence to remove this child.

HEARING EXAMINER'S REPORT

After being warned of the consequences of his plea, Charles Raby pled true to the following:

Allegation #3

On or about October 20, 1986, at approximately 11:30 A.M. at 7719 West Hardy, Houston, Texas, Charles D. Raby intentionally fled from Juvenile Division Officer Donald E. Swonke of the Houston Police Department who was attempting to arrest Charles D. Raby.

Allegation #4

On or about February 9, 1987, at approximately 3:00 P.M. at 3623 Shannon Lake, Humble, Texas, Charles D. Raby intentionally and knowingly entered the residence at 3623 Shannon Lane, Humble, Texas without the effective consent of the owner, W.H. Hopkins and committed the theft of guns, gun shells, a television, a radio, ten - twelve articles of costume jewelry, one Avon necklace, 4 - 5 other necklaces, wristwatches, and a ring belonging to Mr. Hopkins.

FINDINGS OF FACT

The above pleas were accepted after determining that they were knowingly and voluntarily made and were based on the ward's recollection of the incidents.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

As Charles Raby pled true to the Texas Penal Code offenses of Evading Arrest Section 38.04 and Burglary Section 30.02 respectively, I conclude that Charles Raby violated parole rule #5.

DISPOSITION

Charles Raby's parole is revoked. Parole Officer Mary Guerra advised that Charles would be returned to the Statewide Reception Center in Brownwood.

Following his commitment to TYC on April 19, 1985, for evading arrest, Charles was placed at the Brownwood State School. On June 26, 1985, he was transferred to the O'Daniel's Group Home in Waxahachie. Due to behavioral problems, Charles was terminated five months later and transferred to Brownwood State School. Charles was furloughed to his mother on May 23, 1986, and did well at home and school for about four months. After dropping out of school on September 15, 1986, Charles had no contact with his parole officer until February 10, 1987, when he turned himself in for the burglary considered at this hearing.





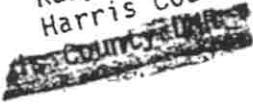

Charles Raby \_\_\_\_\_ has been transferred to the Brownwood State School. He will be living in \_\_\_\_\_ Success \_\_\_\_\_ Dorm with other boys; his daily activities will be coordinated by his caseworker, \_\_\_\_\_ Mary Taggart \_\_\_\_\_ and directed by a trained staff.

Your son will have an individualized program designed to meet his specific social, educational, and recreational needs. An important part of our program is for a student to learn to be responsible for his behavior and to do this, we have the group therapy program and rules of discipline. The major disciplinary tool is "Restrictions," which is restriction from a privilege. For example, he may be required to go to bed early, stay in his room while other boys are enjoying leisure time or on an activity, or he may be required to do some extra work.

For the most serious behavior problems, a student is admitted to our security or disciplinary dormitory temporarily. You will be notified of serious behavior problems, such as escape or attempt escape, serious self-abuse, or assault on another person. If you have reason to believe your son is being treated unfairly, you should contact the assistant superintendent at 915-646-5541.

A professional staff consisting of a medical doctor, nurse, chaplain, consulting psychiatrist, psychologist, social workers, and teachers will be involved in the total program to assist your son in learning to cope with daily problems in living as well as preparing for his return to the community.

In addition to the staff at the school, your son will be assigned a parole officer from the \_\_\_\_\_ Houston \_\_\_\_\_ office. His parole officer will be coming to see you in the near future. He will answer your questions or assist you in getting answers for your questions.

We encourage you to keep in contact with your son. For your information, a copy of our "Visiting Rules" is included. When you plan to visit, please notify his caseworker by phone or letter, giving date and time, so that he will be available.

You are encouraged to write as often as possible. Students are allowed to write to parents as frequently as they want. Please address his letters to Brownwood State School, P.O. Box 1267, Brownwood, Texas, 76804. You may call him at 915-646-5541 (please do not call collect). If he is not available when you call, we will help him return the call at the earliest possible time. Students can call home twice a month, but this is a collect call. He may shop in town and on campus for his personal needs; please send money regularly for this purpose. You may also send your child presents or gifts. We do limit the amount of items a student may have in his room for reasons of fire safety. Checks and money orders must be made payable to the student; and cannot be altered after they are prepared.

Your son's program and progress will be reviewed every three months. A report will be sent to his parole officer who will share this information with you.

If you have questions or comments, please feel free to call his parole officer or his caseworker. We are looking forward to working with you during your son's placement at Brownwood State School.

Dear Kelly:

The following is an assessment of Chuck's progress at New Horizons during the past three months.

**MEDICAL AND/OR PHYSICAL:** Chuck is in excellent physical condition. He has had no significant illnesses or injuries since the last report. He is receiving no medication at the present time.

**DEVELOPMENTAL AND CHRONOLOGICAL AGE:** Chuck's physical development is appropriate for his chronological age. He is experiencing some of his adolescent growth at the present time. His emotional development is generally appropriate although in many ways immature particularly in his interaction on a one to one basis. Also he has a tendency to overreact emotionally to minor kinds of incidents and thus bring on some aggressive types of behavior toward his peers particularly.

**ENVIRONMENTAL, FAMILY AND SOCIAL:** Chuck has been in contact with his mother and his sister. Plans are that his sister will come visit him within the next two or three weeks when his case worker comes to see him. He has talked with his mother by telephone and at this point he would like to make a weekend visit with her. He seems to have some emotional involvement as far as his sister is concerned.<sup>14</sup> With his mother he seems to be wanting to fulfill some kind of need but there does not seem to be any strong emotional need that is present.<sup>15</sup> Chuck generally interacts appropriately with peers and staff although he has a tendency as indicated above to overreact to minor incidents and to deal with it thru some hostile kinds of behavior, hitting, pushing, and verbally abusing others.<sup>16</sup> This is very inconsistent behavior in that he does not exhibit it all the time and
